EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Exit Survey of Undergraduate Students Completing Degrees in the Spring of 2009 holds particular importance as it is the first formal exit survey of undergraduates conducted at Western Washington University. This survey was designed to elicit departmental-, college-, and university-level information on student satisfaction, barriers to success, determinants of their major choice, experiences and satisfaction in their major, and post-graduation plans. The survey consisted of a mixture of open ended questions, multiple choice questions, and fill-in-the-blank questions. This report provides descriptive statistics of the multiple choice and the fill-in-the-blank questions. The appendices to this report present count data on two of the sixteen open ended questions: "In what ways has Western exceeded your expectations?" and "In what ways has Western fallen short of your expectations?"

The Office of Survey Research (OSR) uses a mixture of online and telephone methodologies to obtain survey responses. For spring graduates, this exit survey was initiated on May 4, 2009 and continued through June 13, 2009. Initially, students received e-mail survey invitations at their Western Washington University e-mail addresses, reminders three days later, a third invitation sent to any external e-mail address OSR had on record, and then a reminder to that address three days later. After the fourth e-mail, OSR called non-respondents asking them to complete the survey. This entire process of e-mails, reminders, and phone calls was then repeated resulting in some students receiving two phone calls and 8 e-mail invitations. Of the 1,671 WWU spring graduates, OSR received valid responses from 1,166 students, a response rate of 69.8%. Of the 1,166 that responded to the survey, 990 answered all questions. The remaining 176 respondents discontinued the survey sometime prior to the end. This report includes all valid responses, even those from individuals who failed to complete the entire survey.

While spring graduates are the focus of this report, OSR simultaneously surveyed summer, 2009, graduates. Data from summer graduates are not included in the descriptive statistics, however, their open ended responses are included in the appendices which focus on exceeding and falling short of expectations. OSR will present the descriptive statistics for the summer graduates in a future report.

As with any survey, readers should be concerned about sample selection bias; that is, bias which arises because survey respondents are not a random selection from the population of survey recipients. While sample selection bias for Western's exit survey is mitigated through proper survey techniques and a high response rate, its presence should be considered when evaluating data. Section A of this document presents basic statistics comparing all 2009 spring graduates with those graduates who responded to the survey. As found in the general literature on survey responses, women were more likely to respond to surveys (59.7% of respondents are women which make up 57.1% of WWU graduates). Further, responding students tended to earn better WWU grades (mean respondent GPA = 3.26, mean overall GPA = 3.23); were more likely to be first generation college students (36.3% of respondents versus 35.6% of overall students); were more likely to be running start students (9.3% of respondents versus 8.8% of overall students); enrolled in more credits during their final quarter on campus (mean respondent credits of 13.03 versus 12.84 of overall students); were more likely to live on campus during their final quarter and tended to have a higher admission index when they applied to Western (mean respondent AI = 61.69, mean overall AI = 60.86). Taken as a whole, it appears that respondents were better students who were more engaged at the university during their final quarter. However, these differences are small and, given the high survey response rate, are unlikely to significantly impact the descriptive statistics presented herein.

Section B of this report presents all questions asked in the exit survey and shows results from the multiple choice and fill-in-the-blank questions for all respondents. While OSR will leave it to the reader to decide what is informative or striking from this section, we make a few observations here. When asked about starting their college experience over, 84% of students responded that they would again attend Western. 32% claimed they were very satisfied with their Western experience and an additional 56% were satisfied. However, 27% took more time to graduate than what they expected when they first enrolled. Among those who took longer to graduate than expected, the most common reasons given were that they changed their major, they received poor advising prior to choosing a major, and the major they finally picked required a high number of credits. About one-third of Western graduates collaborated with a professor on a research or creative project and two-thirds of these claimed this experience significantly contributed to their learning. 55% reported their principal activity upon graduation is full-time employment and 17% reported their principal activity as attending a full-time graduate or professional school. Of those reporting employment as their primary activity after graduation, 15% are staying in their current job, 13% have accepted an offer of employment, 7% are considering an offer of employment, and 45% were still looking for jobs.

Section C of this report sorts respondents by college and reports data from the multiple choice and fill-in-the-blank questions. 62 respondents received double majors. To make reporting on the major questions easier, these 62 respondents were duplicated resulting in these students counting twice within college (if both majors originated within the same college) or between colleges (if the majors were housed in two different colleges).

Sections D through J report departmental-level statistics by college. Because the Department of Engineering Technology offers a number of individual programs, Section K of this report presents program-level statistics for this department.

This report focuses primarily on responses to multiple choice and fill-in-the-blank questions. However, the exit survey also included the following open-ended questions:

1. In what ways has Western exceeded your expectations? [Frequency data from this question are reported in Appendix A of this report]
2. In what ways has Western fallen short of your expectations? [Frequency data from this question are reported in Appendix B of this report]
3. Why would you choose to {attend a different university; not pursue a bachelor's degree}? [Asked of those who would not choose to attend Western if given the chance to start over]
4. Please list up to three professors, advisors, or staff members who have been particularly influential during your time at Western. Describe how each has been influential.
5. What other factors were important in delaying your graduation? [Asked of those who claimed that it took longer than they expected to graduate and who chose "other" on the list of multiple choice reasons for their delay]
6. Why did you earn a double major? [Asked of those students who earned a double major]
7. When you graduate, approximately how much will be owed for your education? [Asked of those who responded "yes" to "Did you or someone else borrow money to fund your education?"]
8. Please specify your principal activity upon graduation. [Asked of those respondents who chose "other" on the list of principal activities upon graduation]

9. How many job offers have you received? [Asked of those respondents who claimed to be looking for a job and whose principal activity upon graduation was either full- or part-time work]
10. Of those offers, how many are related to your field of study? [Asked of those who have received at least one job offer]
11. What is the name of the company/organization you will work for? [Asked of those who report remaining in their current job or who have accepted employment]
12. What will your title be? [Asked of those who report remaining in their current job or who have accepted employment]
13. To which schools have you been accepted? [Asked of those whose principal activity upon graduation is graduate or professional school and who have been accepted for further education]
14. Which school will you attend? [Asked of those whose principal activity upon graduation is graduate or professional school and who have been accepted an offer of admission]
15. For what degree or certificate (MBA, Ph.D., M.D., etc.)? [Asked of those whose principal activity upon graduation is graduate or professional school]
16. In the space below, please provide an e-mail address where we can reach you in the next year.

One benefit provided by the exit survey is that respondents are tracked using their W number. This provides the opportunity to merge the survey data with Western's data warehouse or data collected by colleges, departments, and the alumni association. Using the W number, it is possible to sort all data, even the open ended responses, and provide them to interested departments and colleges. OSR will be happy to do so upon request. Further, OSR is excited to share anonymous data with researchers who wish to use this data in their academic or professional research.

Clarifying Notes

1. Unless otherwise noted, percentages given are of the number responding to a question divided by the number answering that question. In many cases, percentages do not sum to one hundred because of rounding.
2. Blank spaces indicate zero percent responded to that answer. A report of 0% indicates that the percent of responses rounded down to but is not equal to zero percent.
3. Some questions were asked of a random draw of students leading to shorter surveys for respondents and smaller response rates for these questions. The notes to the question indicate if this is the case.

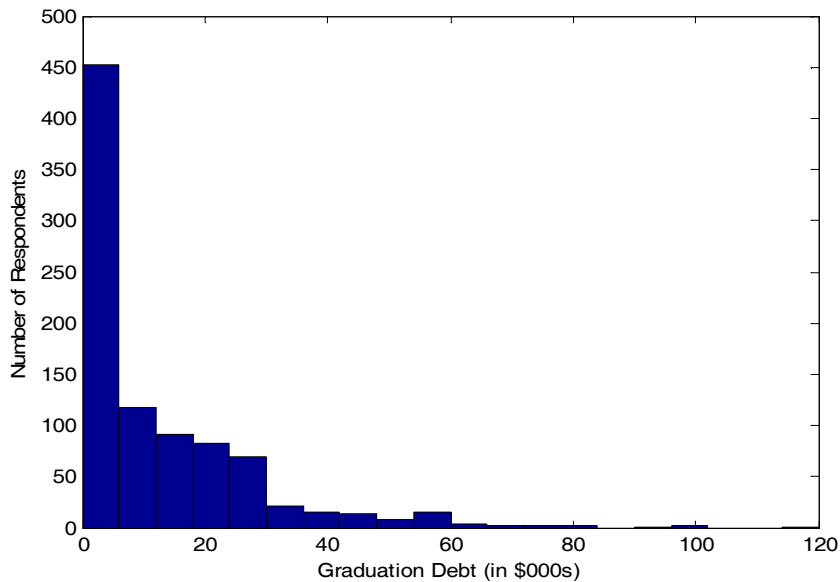
